

CONFESSION - Even though the Easter season is over, it is not time to abandon the practice of frequent Confession of our sins. Each should try to go at least once a month, but more salutary once a week. However, it is not possible for Father to hear Confessions before the High Mass on Sunday. Please come at the appointed times or during the week.

PARTICIPATION - All are asked to vocally and physically participate in the Sacred Mysteries. We need to hear you. While private prayer is of the utmost importance, when we are at community prayer and the Liturgy we should speak loudly and clearly, not whispering to ourselves. It makes a big difference and encourages others to pray and participate. This goes for both the Pauline Rite in English and the Gregorian Rite in Latin, as well as the Holy Rosary.

SCHOOL - We applaud and support all our families who are educating their children at home in these difficult times. We remind you, however, that it as always regarded as a most important part of a true Catholic education that the children go to Mass daily or as often as possible. We thus encourage all of you to take this into serious consideration. Mass on Sunday only is not really a truly Catholic tradition...

SITES - Have you checked our webpage lately or liked our Facebook page? Please do so. There are many resources available. SAVE THE DATE - The Annual Rosary Rally will take place, once again, HERE at Our Lady's Shrine on Saturday, October 12th at 10 AM, with an outdoor procession (weather permitting) and the recitation of the Holy Rosary as we process. It will end with Benediction and Novena to Our Lady of Fatima. All acolytes and Schola members are asked to be here. Rev. Canon has approached four young men to carry Our Lady's statue in the procession.

While the hurricane season marches it still means that we face the threat of the dreaded hurricanes.. We will continue to say this prayer at all the Masses each day here and we ask you to cut this out and place it in a strategic place in your homes or prayer books so that you can say it at home, too. ST. RAYMOND NONNATUS



St. Anna the Prophetess



'Non natus' is Latin for "never born" and Saint Raymond (Ramón) was given his surname because his mother had died in labor two days before he was delivered by cesarean section. The fact that he did not die in his mother's womb was considered an extraordinary event in the early thirteenth century, when a good number of mothers and infants were lost during childbirth. Because of the extraordinary circumstances of his birth, he always felt an affinity for the precarious state of women in labor and their infants. For this reason, midwives, obstetricians and expectant mothers call on him for help in the safe delivery of healthy newborns. Hailing from Catalonia in Spain, Raymond's family were from a noble class. His father attempted to train him to take over the family farms but because of his great devotion to the Virgin Mary, he chose instead to join the Mercedarians, a religious order dedicated to ransoming Christian slaves from the Moors, who occupied much of Spain. The Mercedarians also spiritually administered to Christian slaves in Moorish regions. As the Spanish territory was recaptured, and the Moors driven into North Africa, Raymond Nonnatus followed Christian slaves into Algeria. It was said he spent his entire inheritance ransoming slaves and when he ran out of money he substituted himself for another man's freedom. (To be continued).
