
QUINQUAGESIMA

BUILDING FUND - Continuing as we prepare for the actual work in and outside the Church - most of which will start in February after Candlemas. Many thanks to all of you who have donated thus far. May God increase your fortunes as you are generous to Him!

THEOLOGY CLASS - We will not have class on Ash Wednesday, Feb 17th, due to the High Mass for that special day.

LENTEN FISH FRYS - Due to the necessary and temporary change in Mass time during the installation of the new Church ceiling, the Lenten Fish Frys will begin at 3 PM. That way as many as possible can make it to Mass at 6 PM. After Mass we will have the solemn Stations of the Cross with Benediction. ALL are encouraged to attend. No one can have too many graces!!!



LENTEN DISCIPLINE - As we begin once again the Solemn and beautiful Season of Lent, the Church's principal penitential season, we remind you that fasting and abstinence are in order. No meat, or its byproducts, should be eaten on Fridays, Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and other days of your choice. As much time as possible should be spent at prayer, especially before the Blessed Sacrament. We will have Holy Hour EVERY Thursday of Lent after the 6 PM Low Mass. We will have Benediction and Solemn Stations every Friday at 7 PM. Take advantage of this holy season

CONFESSION - All are reminded to make every effort to confess your sins during Lent. The easter Duty Confession begins on Ash Wednesday until Trinity Sunday (May 30th this year). Rev. Canon will continue to hear Confessions in the Sacristy after the Saturday morning Mass and the Saturday evening Mass.

VOLUNTEERS - We will need volunteers for the upcoming Fish Frys which begin on the first Friday of Lent, Feb. 19th, and will continue on each Friday up to the Friday before Palm Sunday. The Ladies Sodality will also sell desserts.

CSA 2021 - We begin this weekend to hand out and take your pledges and donations. You donated about \$28,000 last year. Please consider repeating and incrementing your donation for this year.
