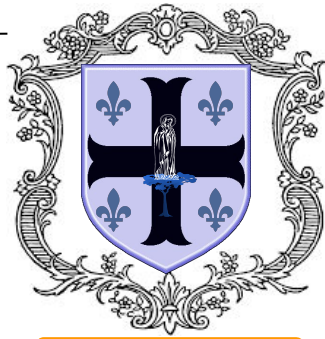


WELCOME TO THE SHRINE of OUR LADY

CHRIST THE KING & ALL SAINTS' PAGEANT - We will celebrate, as usual, the great Feast of Christ, King of the Universe, on the LAST Sunday of this month. There will be the usual High Mass and Benediction of the Blessed sacrament with Consecration of the parish and Shine and its Families to Jesus. There will be a covered dish luncheon in the Hall afterwards during which the children of the Parish will present their saints' costumes. Prizes will be awarded to the best costumes. ALL children are encouraged to participate (from 0-14 years old).

ALL SOULS' DAY - You may find attached to this bulletin and in the Foyer the envelopes for you to request Remembrance for the Souls of the Dearly Departed on All Souls' Day, November 2nd, and throughout the whole month of November. Please print out all your names clearly. Pay attention to directions given also from the Pulpit by the Canon.

ALL SAINTS' AND ALL SOULS' DAY - Being on Sunday All Saints' Day follows that regular schedule. All Souls' Day, Monday, there will be three Masses: 8 AM & 9 AM and another Mass at 6 PM.

THEOLOGY CLASS - According to a lot of interest and commitment shown by parishioners the Canon will offer classes on Wednesday evenings at 7 PM. Let him know by putting your name and the number of potential attendees on a sign-up list in the Foyer. The first class will be, as usual, of Latin pronunciation. ALL are encouraged to attend. It will be on Oct. 21st at 7 PM.

ANNUAL ROSARY RALLY - Once again we hosted the Annual Rosary Rally here as we celebrated the 103rd Anniversary since the last Apparition of Our Lady at Fatima. It was held on Saturday, Oct. 10th beginning with the Low Mass at 8 AM, followed by Novena and the Mysteries of the Rosary as they were in 1917. Place this on your calendars for next year!

The Holy Rosary

The Holy Rosary, as we know it today, has its origins in the life and Apostolate of the great Saint Dominic Guzman, Founder of the Dominican Order, who received it as an aid and spiritual weapon from the Blessed Mother herself while he was struggling to convert the Albigensian heretics in Languedoc, France, in the beginning of the fourteenth century. As such, it is divided into fifteen mysteries, each recalling some aspect of Our Lord's life and the place of the Blessed Mother in them.

Thus, we have the Joyful Mysteries which recall the events of the Incarnation and Nativity of Christ: the Annunciation by the Archangel St. Gabriel; Our Lady's Visitation to St. Elizabeth and family; the Nativity at Bethlehem; Our Lord's Presentation in the Temple forty days after His Birth; and the Finding of the Child Jesus in the Temple teaching the Doctors. The Sorrowful Mysteries, recalling His Passion and Death: His Agony at the Garden of Gethsemani; His Scourging at the pillar in Pilate's palace; His Crowning with thorns; His Carrying of the Cross of our Redemption; and His most sacred Death on that Holy Cross. In the Glorious Mysteries we recall the happy events after His Death: His Glorious Resurrection from the Tomb; His Ascension into Heaven forty days later; His Gift of the Holy Spirit on the newborn Church at Pentecost; the Assumption, body and soul, of the Blessed Mother; Her Coronation as Queen of the Universe by the Holy Trinity after her Assumption. St. John Paul II renewed devotion to a set of Mysteries, the Luminous, which had been composed by a Maltese Priest. However, he made their use totally optional. They can be inserted, as it were in the Mysteries already present - Joyful and Sorrowful. Throughout history there have been many other events or mysteries recalled in the recitation of the Rosary. The importance of the one hundred and fifty Hail Mary's is because even before St. Dominic the Lay Faithful, who did not know how to read, used the 150 Aves instead of the 150 Psalms. As such, the first name of the Rosary was Our Lady's Psalter. It is also called a "crown" for it represents a crown of roses, hence Rosary, with which we spiritually crown and honor Our Lady. In all her Apparitions in modern times Our Lady has asked that we pray the Rosary each day, especially at Fatima. Do you?
