


SHRINE of OUR LADY

CHRIST THE KING - As on every year our Shrine and Parish will celebrate the great Feast of Christ, Our Eternal King, on the LAST Sunday of October, Oct. 31. We will have a covered-dish luncheon and the Annual All Saints' pageant for children up to 13 years of age. Prizes will be given by the sodalities to the children with the best and most ingenious costumes. Parents get to work!

ROSARY RALLY - As usual our Shrine will hold, along with the sponsorship of the Legion of Mary, a Rosary Rally on the Saturday nearest the Feast Of Our Lady of Fatima. This will be held in conjunction with the Low Mass of Saturday, October 16th. Weather permitting we will process from the Hall into the Church with Our Lady's statue (4 men volunteers are needed), the Mass and then the Fifteen Mysteries of the Rosary - as Our Lady gave them to St. Dominic and as she showed the Shepherds of Fatima. Also her Novena will be recited ending with Benediction. There will be a reception in the Hall afterwards.

ALL SOULS' DAY - You may find stapled to this bulletin, as well as on the table in the Foyer, the envelopes for your requests for All Souls' Day, Nov. 2nd. For over a thousand years this has been one of the most important Feasts of the Liturgical calendar. Please return them with your offerings (made out to the Rev. Canon) and include clearly and legibly all the Souls of your family and friends for which he will offer Mass the whole month of November.

LEGION OF MARY - The Rev. Canon has decided that since it is once again not possible to hold the weekend retreat at Sacred Heart Monastery in November, he will hold a Day of Recollection - or Congress - on Saturday November 6th. It will begin with Low Mass, Novena and Benediction. Since it is First Saturday it is a Day of Plenary Indulgence. The Blessed Sacrament will remain exposed until before the Vigil Mass. EVERYONE, not just Legionaries, is invited and encouraged to attend. Ladies' Sodality meeting is postponed till November 13th. Brunch will be had in the Hall and Confessions available. This is a GREAT OPPORTUNITY FOR OUR PARISH AND SHRINE!

The Vision of Pope Jeo XIII and the Prayer to Saint Michael

Exactly 33 years to the day prior to the great Miracle of the Sun in Fatima, that is, on October 13, 1884, Pope Leo XIII had a terrifying vision. When the aged Pontiff had finished celebrating Mass in his private chapel, attended by a few Cardinals and members of his staff, he suddenly stopped at the foot of the altar. He stood there for about 10 minutes, as if in a trance, his face ashen white. Then, going immediately from the chapel to his office, he composed the prayer to St. Michael, with the instructions for it to be said after all Iow Masses throughout the world.

When asked what had happened, he explained that, as he was about to leave the foot of the altar, he suddenly heard voices - two voices, one kind and gentle, the other guttural and harsh. They seemed to come from near the tabernacle. As he listened, he heard the following conversation:

The guttural voice, the voice of Satan in his pride, boasted to Our Lord: 'I can destroy your Church."

The gentle voice of Our Lord: "You can? Then go ahead and do so."

Satan: "To do so, I need more time and more power."

Our Lord: "How much time? How much power?

Satan: "75 to 100 years, and a greater power over those who will give themselves over to my service."

Our Lord: "You have the time, you will have the power. Do with them what you will."

Thus, Pope Jeo XIII decreed that this prayer to St. Michael be said at the end of every Iow Mass throughout the Universal Church, along with the Salve Regina. This practice continued until about 1965, when it was suppressed after Vatican II.
