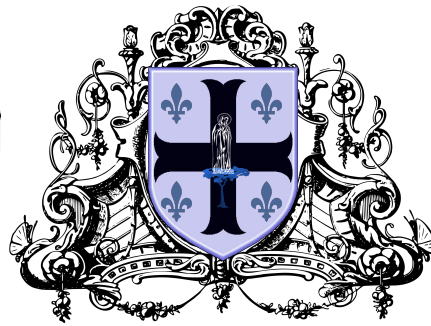


WELCOME TO THE SHRINE of OUR LADY

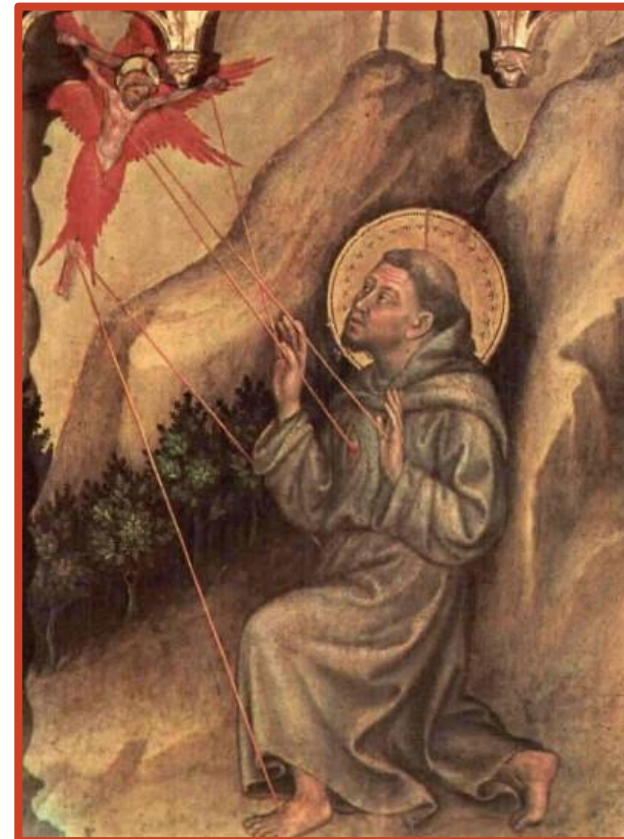

Remember, it is NOT necessary to go to Confession every time one goes to Communion. All should strive to confess at least monthly.

CONFESSION BOOK - Rev. Canon's new book on Confession is available in the back of the Church already. It will be of great help in the examination of your conscience. A donation of \$8 is asked.

THE FEAST OF THE HOLY STIGMATA OF ST. FRANCIS



On September 17th, traditionally is kept the Feast of the Holy Stigmata of St. Francis of Assisi. This recalls how in 1224, on September 17th, St. Francis, already sickly and foreseeing his death, as a result of all the penances and fastings to which he had submitted himself, wished to go on a few days of retreat. Thus he went with another Friar to the nearby mountain, Alverna. There as they were praying a marvelous thing happened! A holy Seraphim from Heaven appeared carrying Jesus crucified nestled in his wings. Suddenly from the wounds of Christ rays of light came forth and pierced St. Francis in the same places: his hands, feet, and side. It was not only a breathtakingly exalting experience, but also very painful. St. Francis bore these glorious and most painful wounds until his dying day on October 4th, 1226. Because of this experience with the Holy Seraphim St. Francis is called the "Seraphic Father", and many things Franciscan are referred to as Seraphic as well. Let us pray to the Seraphic Father for a deeper appreciation of the Passion and Death of Our Lord for our salvation. - Very Rev. Canon Pérez
