## SUMMORUM PONTIFICUM

As we celebrate this coming week the anniversary of Pope Benedict XVI's landmark Motu Proprio, Summorum Pontificum, returning to ALL Catholics and Clergy the right of celebrating and having Mass in the Ancient Rite, the so-called "Tridentine Rite", or more properly as he stated it also, the Gregorian Rite which goes back not only to Pope St. Gregory the Great (590-604) but much more to the Apostolic times, we wish to recall a few of the principles laid down by His Holiness there for us:

"The Supreme Pontiffs have to this day shown constant concern that the Church of Christ should offer worthy worship to the Divine majesty, 'for the praise and glory of His Name' and the good of all His holy Church... Eminent among the Pope who showed such proper concern was Saint Gregory the Great, who sought to hand on to the new peoples of Europe both the Catholic Faith and the treasures of worship and culture amassed by the Romans in preceding centuries. He ordered that the form of the sacred liturgy, both of the Sacrifice of the Mass and the Divine Office, as celebrated in Rome, should be defined and preserved... In this way the sacred liturgy, celebrated according to the Roman usage, enriched the faith and piety, as well as the culture, of numerous peoples... Among the liturgical books of the Roman Rite, a particular place belongs to the Roman Missal, which developed in the city of Rome and over the centuries gradually took on forms very similar to the form which it had in more recent generations... The Roman Missal promulgated by St. Pius V and revised by (Blessed) St. John XXIII is... considered an extraordinary expression of the same lex orandi of the Church and duly honored for its venerable and ancient usage...It is therefore permitted to celebrate the Sacrifice of the Mass following the typical edition of the Roman Missal, which was promulgated by (Blessed) St. John XXIII in 1962 and never abrogated, as an extraordinary form of the Church's Liturgy...For such a celebration with either Missal, the Priest(s) needs no permission from the Apostolic See of from his own Ordinary (Bishop)."
