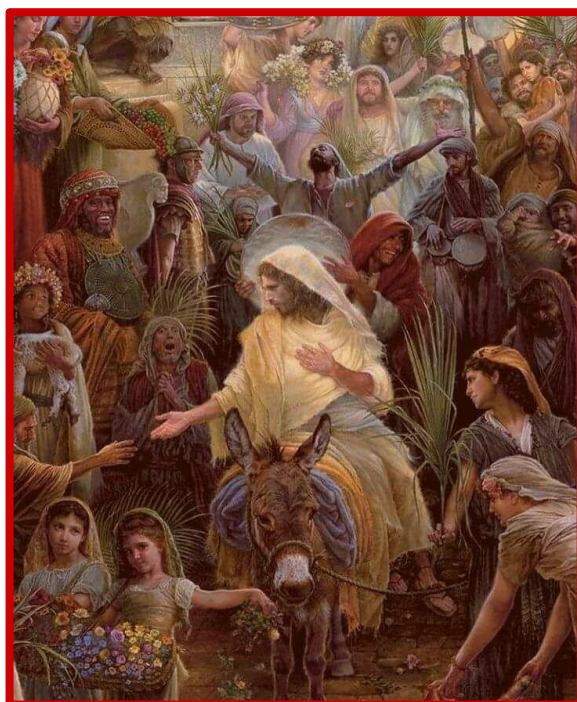


WELCOME TO THE SHRINE OF OUR LADY

DIVINE MERCY - We will celebrate the scheduled Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament on Sunday, April 7, at 3PM. All are encouraged to be here. Schola and Acolytes and Ushers please be here at 2:30.

PENANCE - As is the Canon Law of the Church for centuries, ALL Catholics must go to Confession during the season of Lent and Easter - thus the term "Easter Duty". This period ends with the Eve of Trinity Sunday, which is May 26 this year.

SACRAMENTS - We remind everyone that one must be a Catholic in order to receive Holy Communion. Do not go up to the Communion Rail. In addition, all those who plan to receive First Communion, Confirmation, or Holy Matrimony need to follow the prescriptions of the Law.

NOVENAS - Our Lady's Novena will be prayed Monday, March 25, after the 8:30 AM Mass. The Novena to the Infant of Prague will be prayed Tuesday, March 26, after the 6 PM Mass.

ANNUNCIATION - Because of Holy Week and the Octave of Easter which take precedence, the Solemnity of the Annunciation will be celebrated on April 8. It is the Incarnation of the Son of God in the Womb of the Blessed Ever-Virgin Mary.

VOLUNTEERS - We give a hearty thank-you to all those who have volunteered during Lent, Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum: the Acolytes; the Schola and their Directress; the Lectors, and Ushers who help to make us safe. Finally, we thank our beloved Rector and Pastor, Canon Pérez for all his continuous and untiring efforts in our behalf. God bless them all!

LAWN MAINTENANCE - With Spring upon us, the growing season is, too. We will soon put out a sign-up sheet for the men to take turns mowing the lawns every two weeks. The Sacred Days of Holy Week

Sunday of Palms and of the Passion

Our Lord enters Jerusalem as King and Messiah, acclaimed by the populace. "Let the King of Glory enter."

Monday of Holy Week

Our Lord retreats, as it is not yet His Hour, and goes to the home of Sts. Lazarus, Mary and Martha. He is in hiding so to speak. All the crosses are veiled to signify this.

Tuesday of Holy Week

Behind the scenes Judas Iscariot, the perfidious Traitor, plots with the Sanhedrin and Pharisees against Our Lord.

Wednesday of Holy Week (Spy Wednesday)

The Crime is committed. The Betrayal is accomplished. Judas receives thirty pieces of silver to betray his Lord.

Holy Thursday

As the Passion unfurls, Our Lord celebrates the Passover (the last) and establishes the Holy Eucharist and Holy Orders to propagate it until the end of time. Our Lord gives Holy Communion to His Apostles, and to us. The Priesthood is established. The Hour has come! The Passion begins at the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus is arrested with a Kiss...

Good and Holy Friday

The Holy Sacrifice is consummated! Our Salvation is wrought upon the Gibbet of the Cross! Our Lord is buried...

Holy Saturday

All is silent. Our Lord is in the tomb of St. Joseph of Arimathea. Hearts are broken and confused - except the Immaculate's. The silence of the Tomb reigns this sad day.

All Catholics should recite, or chant, the Regina Coeli, which replaces the Angelus, during the Paschal Season. There are many graces and indulgences attached. We will also be chanting it after most Masses.

R. Pray for us to God, alleluia.

V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.

R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

Let us pray.

O God, Who gave joy to the world through the Resurrection of Thy Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of His Mother, the Virgin Mary, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen.
